### Celebrating Britains Indigenous Peoples (and its History)

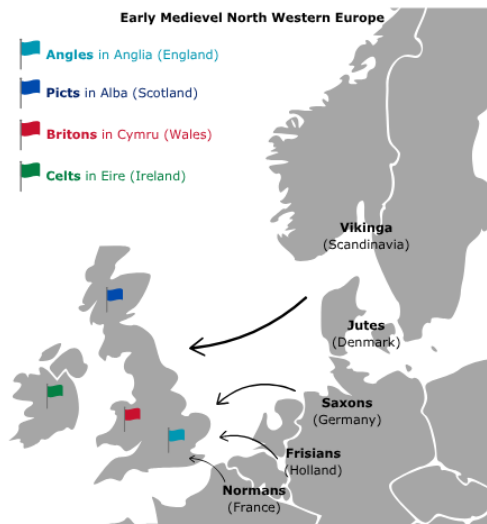
Britain as an official and joint nation is only a couple of hundred years old... but its indigenous peoples have been living on the British Isles for millennia.

Those peoples are individually known as the; **English, Scottish, Welsh** and **Irish**.

A peoples with common ancestors, shared history, and with equally loved and respected culture.

British nowadays is a Nationality, but its majority people are all ethnically from the same stock, intertwined through thousands of years of cohabitation, trade, wars and conflict, but also **blood**.

Not a pure bloodline by any means, with many centuries of invasion, conquest and eventual integration by our neighbours from many different parts of Northwestern Europe, and of course the legendary **Romans** before them all.

Early **Britons** (ancestors of the Welsh) which inhabited the mainland were pushed further west by the Roman conquest of Britannia beginning in 43AD, before standing their ground and forcing a cooperative existence in Wales, and parts of Cornwall, with the **Saxons** (and some **Frisian** settlers) arriving some 500 years later during the decline of the Roman Empire.

The **Saxons** had maybe the biggest impact on English history, with their roughly 300 year conflict with the invading **Viking** forces (and the **Jutes**), who for a time conquered the now **Anglo-Saxons**, before being united by **Alfred the Great** and leading the fight back...

... what followed (about 200 years afterwards) was the **Norman** invasion which somewhat changed the cultural landscape in the British Isles, especially in England - **almost 1000 years ago**.

Since that time - 1000(ish) years, Britain with all its sub-ethnicities has remained a largely homogenous culture, with its diversified make-up (in the early days) solidifying into a single ethnic group; **The British** - that was spread around the world via the **British Empire**, which is now commonly known as the "**Anglo-Sphere**".

The Anglo-Sphere built the modern world, and brought civilisation to many places around the world, as well as introducing these foreign cultures to Christianity, along with laws, language and modernity, as well as literature, the arts, science, medicine and technological improvements.

For roughly 1500 years Anglo-Christian culture has been a major part of the "British way of life", and we're proud to be a part this culture - one what has changed and made better the world we all live in today.
